# **Need Encouragment? Need Hope?**

hese needs are vital to all of us in days of stress and anxiety. We're living in them, thanks to the world's chaos, thanks to weather catastrophes and thanks to sticker shock wherever we go to make a purchase of some kind. Add to all this, your personal experience of losing a child. Can you use some encouragement? Some hope? Maybe you wonder, are they "out there?"

The Bible sets us on the pathway to discover and embrace them.

Look with me at Romans 15:4 as an example:

> "For whatever was written in earlier times was written for our instruction, so that through perseverance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope."

When you need encouragement or hope—for a moment or a lifetime always always go to Scripture. Encouragement. Hope. Straight from the


heart of God Himself—can be found throughout His Word.

For example—there's **Psalm 23**. You know it very well. But, have you read it, heard it and recited it so much that you've overlooked or forgotten the incredible things God is telling you because He wants to encourage you and give you hope? Read Psalm 23 again—slowly, deliberately, taking the time to ponder each verse, each line. Yes, it was written by a man, who, by the way, was also a bereaved dad, several times over; a man who needed encouragement and hope in so many situations in his life. David wrote the words but it was under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Think about just this one phrase in that entire Psalm: "The Lord is my Shepherd"— and because of that, "I (you) shall not want for anything"—ANYTHING—not even encouragement or hope.

Every verse of that one Psalm is filled with ways God can provide encouragement and hope for you. God, Himself, the One Who created you; the One Who knows you better than

> anyone knows you; the One Who is sovereign over everything in this world and in your life (Yes! Even the most painful of situations); the One Who cares about you; the One Who provides for you; the One Whose plans for you, despite what you may be feeling, are absolutely to "give you a future and a **HOPE**" according to **Jeremiah 29:11**; the One Who loves you enough to send His only Son, Jesus, to die for you ... He's the One Who has filled His Word, the



chief end now and forever.

There are SO many Scripture passages that can feed your aching heart. When you need encouragement, when you need hope reach for your Bible.

"Your faithfulness, Lord, will support me. When my anxious thoughts multiply within me, Your comfort delights my soul." Psalm 94:18-19



# "See I have refined you, though not as silver; I have tested you in the furnace of affliction." -Isaiah 48:10

The Lord asked Abraham for his most precious possession, his son, Isaac. Abraham started out for Mt. Moriah obedient, but perplexed. His mind was a cauldron of anxiety and fear mixed with an obedient faith. He walked with his jaw set and his head down.

I was like that when my grandson, Jonathan, was suddenly stricken with a mysterious virus and lapsed into a coma that lasted five weeks. I went about my work in a stoic way, my head down and my mind in confusion. Every moment became a mental and spiritual battlefield, a struggle for spiritual integrity.

"On the third day Abraham looked up..." (Genesis 22:4). It took me a long time too, to look up and make any sense out of our loss of Jonathan. I still don't know the "why" but I'm not looking down any more and as I look up, I see more and more of Jonathan's continuing ministry to our lives.

In the death of our loved ones, as in the death of God's own Son, we see what life really is. The false ideas of invincibility, pride and grandeur come tumbling down and we see ourselves as weak and vulnerable. It is at this point that I lift up my eyes and see the Lord afresh. I see His loving hand; I feel His tender touch and though I remain often perplexed, my faith in a caring God grows stronger.

As long as I live, Jonathan will minister to me in a personal way. He will give me gifts of strength to face life, commitment to God's service and perhaps most of all, a value system that is not materialistic. In that sense, until we meet again, he will always be with me.

R ecently we've had opportunities to begin some new BASIS Support Groups. All our BASIS Groups, including the new ones. are listed below.

Some ask, "What is the value of a support group?" Perhaps, as you read on, you will find the answer to the question.

## What do we do at our Support Groups?

- We welcome everyone. Some groups have light refreshments and beverages for people to enjoy as they arrive.
- We make introductions. Members share their own names, and, if they wish, the name of their child who died and the circumstances of the death. NO ONE is pressured to do this.
- We have a devotional thought on a pertinent topic. The goal of the devotional is always to point people to the Source of all comfort, the Lord Jesus Christ.
- We have a discussion time. The leader of the group will have a question prepared to share; but, the discussion can take whatever direction the members need.
- There is a time to pray for each other. Sometimes the leader will pray for all. Sometimes a member will pray. Sometimes members will pray for another member, though that would depend on how well people in the group know each other. Not everyone is comfortable praying aloud.

People attend support groups for a variety of reasons. Perhaps they don't have support from their family or friends or even their church. They need a place to share their story where they won't be judged for grieving in a "wrong" way. Everyone there has a story so everyone in the group welcomes the opportunity

to listen or to share. As members listen to each other, under the guidance of the leader, they find helpful ideas on how to grieve; they find others with similar circumstances they can identify with; they hear about books to read or seminars to attend. Our groups are a safe place to speak, to allow emotions to rise to the surface, to find understanding, compassion, comfort, to hear prayers lifted in your behalf, and, most especially, to be reminded of God's love.

A time typically comes when the griever's thoughts are able to change focus from their own hurt to realizing that there are others in their life who also hurt. It becomes important to reach out to family, friends, church family and neighbors who have lost a child. The desire to help them grows and, in the process of that, those who are grieving find their own grief eased—even a little.

God tells us He will never leave us or forsake us. Our groups reflect this God of love, compassion and comfort as we all walk together in this grieving process.

If you have time, passion and a heart to want to become involved with BASIS, here are some ways you can do that.

- Lead or assist a support group.
- Help to develop a Podcast.
- Write notes of encouragement to bereaved parents.
- Write an article for our "Parents Share" column in BASIS' quarterly newsletter, RENEW.
